

## Preliminary Day-to-day program Summer course D24

Dear students,

Unfortunately it will not be possible to follow this course face-to-face this year, due to the current COVID-19 crisis. The good news is, however, that you can still participate in an online setting.

While this means that you will not be able to explore The Netherlands, it does mean that we can broaden our knowledge and clinical reasoning skills together.

The course consists of different teaching methods: a-synchronous lectures and (group) assignments, live interactive lectures, 'meet the expert' and online group collaboration during case based learning. The day-to-day program contains an a-synchronous part. As not all participants will be based in the same time zone, please feel free to schedule this part to your convenience.

The live sessions will start with a lecture/ meeting in the digital classroom, which is complemented with a (group) assignment and case based discussions.

In total, the program will be about 6-7 hours per day, 4 hours will be live in the digital classroom with all the participants together.

The time of the live lectures will be set when it is known where the participants are based. This will most likely be from about 16:00-20:00 CET/UTC+1.

This course is interactive. You will be asked to participate in class.

The course does include one or two short presentations by the participants. You will receive more information and a more detailed schedule as soon as possible.
